

First Time Patients

First time patients (First time patients and patients who have not visited the hospital for medical examination for a while.)

Patients without a referral

- During opening hours, please come to the "First Time Patients Counter" on the first floor of the main building.
- Please bring your Health Insurance Card.
- If you have a Patient ID Card, please bring it.

Regarding referrals

The Community Health-care Medical Center offers a referral outpatient system.

- First time patients, please bring a referral (patient referral document) from your primary care physician when possible.
- Patients with referrals are able to make appointments.
- You can avail the medical examination even if you
 do not have a referral (patient referral document),
 but in that case JPY 7,000 (plus tax) will be
 charged as "first-time consultation fee" in
 addition to the medical fee.

*Depending on the hospital department, we may refuse to see you if you do not have a referral letter.

In addition, we offer "specialized examinations and treatments" at our hospital and, once the patient's condition stabilizes we give a referral (patient referral document) to your primary care physician or another medical facility.



Return Patients

For those visiting for the second time or more (regular or continuous patients)

- Please bring your Patient ID Card.
- If you have an appointment, you can check in by using the self-check-in machine.
- We need to confirm the details of your Health Insurance Card once a month.

About Health Insurance Cards and Patient ID Cards

- If you have a "National Health Insurance Recipient Card for Seniors" (between 70 and 75 years old), please bring it along with your Health Insurance Card.
- If you have an "Eligibility Certificate for Ceiling-Amount Application," or a Municipal Medical Certificate, etc., please bring it along with your Health Insurance Card.
- If we cannot confirm the details of your Health Insurance Card for over 2 months, you will be required to pay all costs at your own expense.
- If the details of your Health Insurance Card have changed, please notify us at a reception counter.

Re-examination medical fee JPY 3,000 (plus tax)

< Applicable patients >

- This is a separate fee which is charged to the patient whose condition has stabilized and who has been referred to another medical facility, but choose to continue to be examined in this hospital at his/her own request.
- No additional fee will be charged to the patient who brings a referral (patient referral document) from another medical facility for medical examination at this center.
