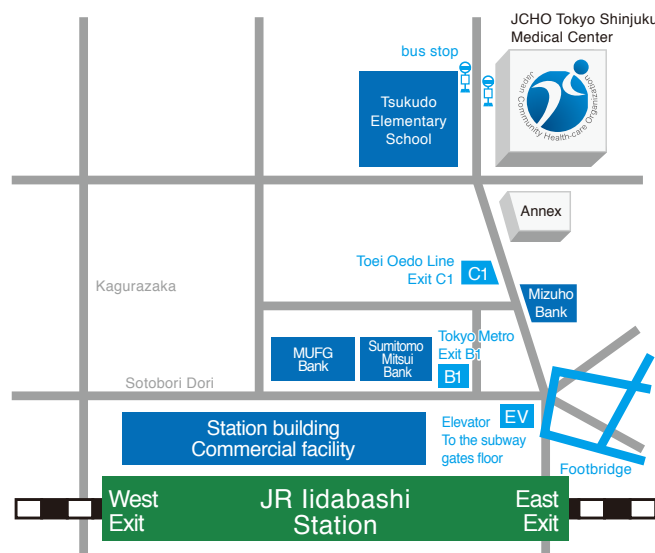
Access

Patients without a referral

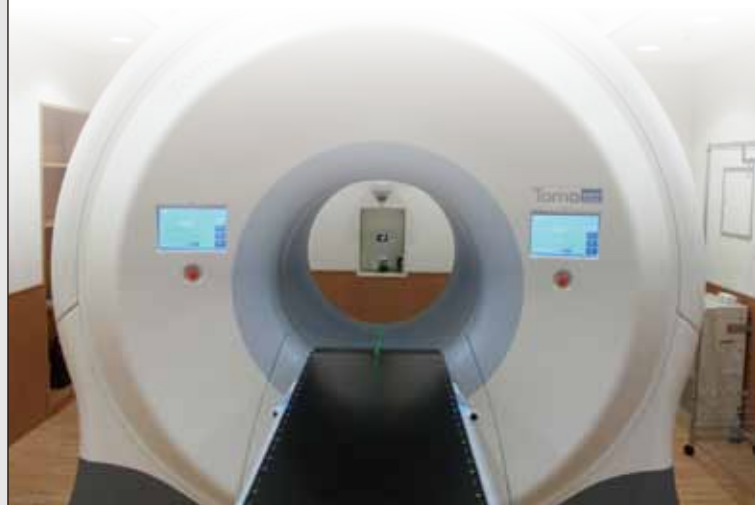
Reception Hours Weekdays 8:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

Closed Days Saturdays, Sundays, National Holidays, New Year's Holiday (Dec. 29 - Jan. 3)

- During opening hours, please come to the “First Time Patients Counter” on the first floor of the main building.
- Please bring your Health Insurance Card.
- If you have a Patient ID Card, please bring it.

Regarding referrals

- First time patients, please bring a referral (patient referral document) from your primary care physician when possible.
- Patients with referrals are able to make appointments.
- Patients without referrals (patient referral documents) will be seen but will have to pay 3,000 yen (excluding tax) that will not be covered by your insurance.



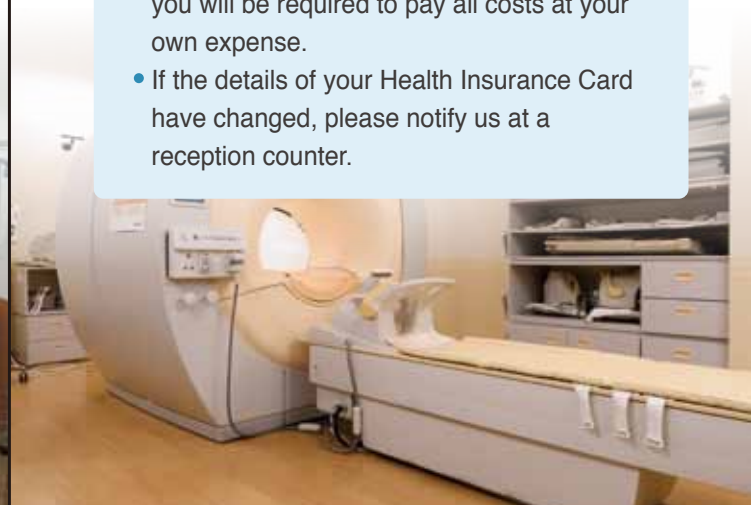
Return Patients

For those visiting for the second time or more (regular or continuous patients)

- Please bring your Patient ID Card.
- If you have an appointment, you can check in by using the self-check-in machine.
- If you do not have an appointment, you can come to the **Outpatient Reservation Center** to make one.
- We need to confirm the details of your Health Insurance Card once a month.

About Health Insurance Cards and Patient ID Cards

- If you have a “National Health Insurance Recipient Card for Seniors” (between 70 and 75 years old), please bring it along with your Health Insurance Card.
- If you have an “Eligibility Certificate for Ceiling-Amount Application,” or a Municipal Medical Certificate, etc., please bring it along with your Health Insurance Card.
- If we cannot confirm the details of your Health Insurance Card for over 2 months, you will be required to pay all costs at your own expense.
- If the details of your Health Insurance Card have changed, please notify us at a reception counter.
